COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is designed to allow trainees to test their theoretical knowledge of pedagogy in practice, mostly in an EFL setting. The trainees will experience students' English level assessment, various aspects of classroom management, lesson planning and lesson presentation in order to achieve effective learning of students and improve their overall English competencies. This training process will be aided by the course of Teaching Techniques where the trainees' practical teaching experience will be discussed, analyzed, and rectifying strategies offered. Finally, each trainee will be observed twice, and each observation will be followed by a detailed feedback session.

- To apply acquired theory in practice successfully
- To identify student needs reliably
- To adapt lesson plans to students needs effectively and promptly
- To guarantee student learning and improvement
- To experiment with different teaching techniques and methods
- To increase awareness of own teaching performance
- To implement observation feedback suggestions in future classes
