The aim of the conference is to bring together doctoral researchers from the University of Innsbruck and the University of Lower Silesia to share knowledge and practices in teacher education and school research. Our focus is on spanning the continuum of theoretical, methodological and practical knowledge and competencies of researchers from different contexts in order to develop deeper understanding of the realities and discourses of teacher education and school research in contemporary Europe.

The conference is a collaborative international venture that developed based on the European Doctorate in Teacher Education (EDiTE), a Horizon 2020 multinational EU project. The intention is to build on the established expertise and network and create the opportunity for a larger network of emerging researchers to think and work together in developing their projects in the European dimension.

We especially invite scholars with limited prior international experience to share and further develop their projects in an international collaborative context. The conference will be an opportunity to present research projects (in different stages of development), to receive constructive critique and support in discussions with experts and peers, and to build connections within an international research community.
