## STUDY IN ENGLISH AT ULS

### Profile: Cultural Animation and Museum Education

This undergraduate program is addressed to students who wish to pursue studies and work in the broadly understood area of cultural education. Students will learn how to prepare self-education workshop programs, courses perfecting amateur artistic skills in a variety of disciplines of art, exhibitions and museum classes for school children and adults. They will become familiar with the fundamentals of art and museum management, the financing of culture, including the development of projects suitable for obtaining funding from a variety of sources (including funds from the European Union, public and private sources). Graduates of this program will be prepared to work in cultural and non-school based educational institutions (museums, community centers, centers for cultural activities, organizations specialized in the popularization of culture, associations and non-governmental organizations). They will be skilled in the creative usage of contemporary media for dissemination, promotion and animation of cultural projects. Graduates of this program can also work as teachers in the public and private school system. After the completion of this first-degree program, graduates are entitled to pursue second-degree studies at ULS or other European universities.

# START YOUR STUDIES IN THE SUMMER

University of Lower Silesia



International students are encouraged to begin their studies at ULS in the summer and earn a full semester of credits. The courses introduce students to Poland, to Wrocław and the socio-historical context. Students can also develop their English and/or Polish-language skills. The summer semester (July – September) includes the following courses:

## Experiencing the New Europe

Lasts the whole month of July and offers two intensive courses in urban studies/anthropology and cultural/historical studies. This interactive program, which combines classroom study with on-site experiential learning is an ideal way to learn about Wrocław and Central Europe and includes field trips to Krakow and Prague. The courses are taught by international faculty and are organized jointly by the University of Lower Silesia and State University of New York Brockport (USA). Successful completion of ENE allows students to earn 6 US credits or 20 credits under the European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS).

## Intensive English Language Summer School

Lasts three weeks in August and is organized in cooperation with New School University in New York. Students take classes on six different levels of difficulty, based on their entry skills. The classes are taught by native speakers – teachers from the United States. This summer school is an ideal way for international students to perfect their English-language speaking and writing skills, which will be needed during their further studies at ULS. Students can earn 5 ECTS credits for participation in this course.

## Polish Language Course

Students wishing to learn Polish language in order to communicate in everyday life in Poland or who wish to undertake part of their studies at ULS in Polish can enroll in Polish-language courses on all levels of difficulty. The number of ECTS credits (maximum 5 ECTS) will depend on the individual amount of study time completed.

## Tutoring, Individual Research Projects, Internships

In September, international students can start working individually with assigned academic staff on the preparation and completion of specific research projects. They can take advantage of one-on-one consultations with professors and/or they can spend time pursuing practical training in internship settings. The number of ECTS credits (maximum 5 ECTS) will depend on the individual amount of study time completed.
